HASS stands for Humanities and Social Sciences. This subject will combine History and Civics and Citizenship this semester. Students will learn to distinguish between rules and laws. In the history side of HASS the students will also learn about early sea exploration, Captain Cook and his exploration of the Pacific region, why England sent convicts to Australia, the journey of the First Fleet and the settlement of Australia at Sydney Cove.

Information

English

This term students will be reading Roald Dahl's 'The Twits' and focusing on the narrative structure and characterization. They will be expected to write a follow up chapter as an assessment. Students will also be examining

humour in poetry and will identify and analyse literary devices in a range of humorous poetry.

Mathematics

This semester in Mathematics students will learn a variety of mathematical concepts. Students will have opportunities to develop their understandings of number and place value, fractions and decimals along with units of measurement. Students will be exposed to a number of problem solving activities.



Homework

Each Monday students will be given Homework on their laptop One Note. It is expected to be completed by Friday. Homework will consist of learning weekly spelling words, number facts and completing a homework task. Students should be encouraged to read every day and utilize the online learning programmes of Reading Eggs and Mathletics. If students do not have a BYOD, they will be allocated a homework book to be taken home on Monday and returned on Friday.

Communication

Communication between school and home regarding your child's learning and behaviour is vital for the best learning outcomes.
