2021 Daily Routine

8.15: Classroom door opens at this time. Children should place their water bottle, iPad and "BEE" folder in the appropriate places.

8.20: Reading Bell

8.30: Lessons commence. If students arrive after the 8.30 bell, they will need to collect a late slip from the office.

8.30 – 10.30: Morning session/ Literacy Block

Daily writing, Reading groups, spelling, grammar and punctuation, handwriting.

10.30 - 10.40: Eating time

10.40 - 11.00: Play time

11.00 – 1.00: Middle session/ Numeracy Block

Math mentals, problem solving, math activities, math groups.

Homework

Homework fosters the development of independent study and work habits. It will be issued weekly on Monday and should be returned on Friday for marking. Homework consists of:

Spelling — Using a list of words relating to the current English unit as well as some personal spelling words. The children use the *Look, Say, Cover, Write, Check* strategy nightly. Words will vary according to individual needs.

Maths – Revision of the previous week's math's concepts.

Reading – Students are to read to a parent nightly. You are welcome to use your own books if you prefer. Home Readers will be distributed in Week 3.

Swimming

Swimming will commence in week four this year for year three students and will continue every Friday through to week eight. Please remind students to pack their swimmers, goggles, towel and thongs. Students can wear their own caps if they prefer. Please make sure all children have their clothing labelled.

Reading Groups

A little inspiration from research: Recent studies indicate that when parents are actively involved in their child's school life, the child will be more motivated to learn and develop a greater appreciation of the importance of education.

Parent involvement promotes continuity between the learning environment and other contexts in children's lives. Furthermore, they feel empowered when they have a team of adults who are committed to bringing out their best.

Reading groups will commence in Week 2. These are 25-30 minute sessions, 5 days a week.
