## Background Information

We believe that children learn at individual rates and that they learn best from different methods. Therefore, a variety of learning experiences are essential to encompass their various styles of learning (auditory, visual, tactile and oral) and Gardner's Multiple Intelligences (Smarts).

We believe our role, as their teachers are to establish and structure the environment so that it gives focus, direction, support and challenge to their learning. In addition, although we recognise their individuality, being able to work co-operatively is also important in order to develop leadership skills.

## Term 1 Learning Topics

#### English

In Unit 1, students will read, view and listen to a variety of everyday procedural texts and familiar stories that involve a procedure. Students develop multimodal instructions for a procedure.

In Unit 2, students will read and listen to a range of poems. They will create an imaginative reconstruction of a familiar poem. Students will then present their poem to a familiar audience.

#### Word of the Week

Each week students will learn a new focus word to help expand their vocabulary.

#### **Mathematics**

In Number and Algebra, students will revise counting in ones and investigate skip counting in 2s, 3s 5s and 10s from 0 to 100. They will also learn a range of mental computation strategies for addition and subtraction and investigate the connection between them. In Measurement & Geometry, students will recognise and order the days of the week and months of the year. They will learn which months occur in each season and use calendars to identify the date and locate specific information. Students will estimate, measure and compare lengths using informal units of measurement. In Statistics and Probability, students will collect, record and represent data using tally marks, tables and picture graphs.

#### Science

Mrs Lajiness is our specialist Science teacher. Students will investigate and compare the life stages of living things. The students will create a storyboard of the stages of a living thing.



## Humanities and Social Sciences – HASS (Geography)

Students will investigate the key features of the local environment. They will develop an understanding of the states of Australia and major geographical divisions of the world. Students will design their own maps of familiar places.

## Arts

Students will explore the use of colour in visual arts. They will analyse artworks and create a variety of art works using primary, secondary, warm and cool colours.

#### Health

Mr Kutcher is our specialist Health and Physical Education teacher. Students will investigate the concept of what health is and which foods and activities make them healthy. They will explore opportunities in the classroom environment where healthy and safe practices can be implemented. Students will also identify the actions that they can apply to keep themselves and others healthy and safe in their classroom.

## Digital Technologies

Students will explore the various changes in technology to explore digital systems and their use.

#### Homework

Homework fosters the development of independent study and work habits. It provides students with opportunities to plan and budget their time, which helps develop a degree of self-discipline. You can best help by making sure they have a quiet environment in which to work. Give encouragement, discuss your child's work and assist them when necessary, however, do not take over and do it for them.



In Year 2, Homework will be accessible through the online platform, Seesaw. If your child does not have access to a device at home, a worksheet will be provided for them. Spelling words will be written in their Homework book. Homework will be assigned every Monday and will be marked every Friday.

Term 1 – Homework will consist of daily reading of 10 –15 minutes. Reading activities are also available from the online Reading Eggs programme <a href="www.readingeggs.com.au">www.readingeggs.com.au</a>. Mathematics activities are available from <a href="www.mathletics.com.au">www.mathletics.com.au</a>. Daily practise of number facts and spelling words are essential. Spelling and number facts will be tested every Friday. You can help your child by listening to their reading daily, hearing their spelling words, testing them on their number facts and helping them access the online learning activities through Seesaw.



#### Home Readers

Home readers will be sent home every week. Please ensure all home readers are returned daily in your child's BEE folder. If you are interested in helping us change the readers on a weekly basis please contact the classroom teacher.

#### *iPads*

iPads will be utilised to enhance classroom programs from the beginning of Week 2. Any iPad which is to be used as a part of the BYOD program will need to be registered with the school and Parents/Guardians will need to fill out and sign our 'Acceptable Use Agreement', before students can bring them to school to use in the classroom. Insurance of all BYOD iPads is the responsibility of the Parent/Guardian. No responsibility will be taken by the school or others for damage. iPads will need to be taken to the classroom by the students and placed on the iPad rack each morning. Parents/Guardians are required to provide suitable, durable casing and a protective bag to transport the device. If the iPad is a device used by all family members then careful monitoring of the camera roll content will need to be ensured.

It is the responsibility of the Parent/Guardian and the child, to make sure the device is fully charged ready to start each day. It is the responsibility of Parents/Guardians to back up any files, photographs and their apps to iTunes as appropriate. Although every care will be taken, the staff at Pimpama State School will not be held liable for any accidental erasure of apps, files or photos. If in the unfortunate event that this does occur; parents will be responsible for restoring these through iTunes. What if I choose not to participate in the program? All teachers have access to school iPads during class time that can be borrowed for class activities.

## Swimming Lessons

In Weeks 1, 5, 6 and 7 children will be attending swimming lessons. Swimming is a part of the H.P.E. Curriculum and students are expected to attend. These will be every Friday for four weeks, commencing in Week 1. and concluding Week 7. Students will need to bring swimwear, thongs to wear and a towel. Goggles are optional. #### Camp

An overnight camp to Numinbah Valley Environmental Centre has been organised later in the year in Term 4. More information will be issued at a later date.
