

Year 3 Term 2

From the Year 3 team

It has been a wonderful experience getting to know your children. We have established routines and expectations and are looking forward to a term filled with fun and learning. We trust your child has had a happy beginning to the school year and is as excited as we are about Term 2.

Term 2 Learning Goals

Literacy - Students will plan and create an adaptation of their favourite story. The story may be told from the perspective of a new or existing character, or set in a similar or different setting. They can use ideas, context, vocabulary or style from the original narrative as a model for developing their own text. Students will plan notes about the decisions and actions of their characters, setting/s and plot. They will draft their narrative in simple paragraphs and edit their work to improve meaning and structure.

Numeracy – Students will partition, rearrange and regroup two- and threedigit numbers in different ways to assist in calculations. They will extend and use single-digit addition and related subtraction facts and apply additive strategies to model and solve problems involving two- and three-digit numbers. Students will present unit fractions and their multiples in different ways. They will find unknown values in number sentences involving addition and subtraction. Students will create algorithms to investigate numbers and explore simple patterns. They will estimate and compare measures of duration using formal units of time. Students will use familiar units when estimating, comparing and measuring the attributes of events. They will make, compare and classify objects using key features.

Hass - Students will identify, describe and evaluate cultural celebrations and commemorations from around the world. Students will research an event and communicate their findings.

Art - Students will create an Aboriginal Australian Landscape Artwork using the 7 elements of design. Students will reflect and write a paragraph describing which art elements have been used in their artwork.

Digital Technology - Students will investigate different forms of messaging in everyday life, including sign language, binary code and braille.

<u>School Routines</u>

Prior to 8.00am students are to be seated quietly outside the Banksia Building (Year 1).
