

Year 3 Term 3

From the Year 3 team

Half way already! Time sure flies when you are having fun. This term is another action-packed term with the school disco, science fair and year 3 excursion, just to name a few. We hope you all enjoyed the school holidays and that students are as ready and eager for Term 3 as we are.

Learning Goals

Literacy - Students will research an Australian animal of their choice and create an information report using their iPad. They must include the following sub headings: Classification, Appearance, Habitat, Diet and Conclusion. Students will present their information report orally to the class.

Numeracy - Students will use mathematical modelling to solve practical problems involving single-digit multiplication and division. They will recall multiplication facts for two, threes, fours, fives and tens, using a range of strategies. Students will use familiar metric units when estimating, comparing and measuring the attributes of objects mass and capacity. They will represent money values in different ways. Students will identify angles as measures of turn and compare them to right angles. They will interpret and create two-dimensional representations of familiar environments.

Hass - Students will explore the similarities and differences in places near and far. They will represent places on a map as well as represent, interpret and compare climate data between places. Students will then design a brochure for their chosen neighbouring country.

<u>Art</u> – Dance: Students learn and perform a choreographed dance in front of their peers and teachers. Students are assessed on space, time, dynamics and dance ethics.

Digital Technology - Students will explore coding blocks using the 'Scratch' program to animate characters using iteration, sequencing and conditional statements.



Homework

Homework fosters the development of independent study and work habits. It will be issued weekly on Monday and should be submitted on Friday for marking. This term we are introducing spelling as part of the weekly homework tasks. Students will take a photo of their weekly spelling words and dictation to read and practice. Term 3 homework will consist of:

Literacy – A variety of sentence extensions, grammar and editing tasks. PLD spelling words and dictation reading.

<u>Maths</u> – Revision of the previous week's math concepts.

<u>Reading</u> – Students are to read a book of their choice and complete the reading tasks.
