From the Year 3 team

Half way already! Time sure flies when you are having fun. This term is another action-packed term with the Colour Run, Cross Country, Year 3 Excursion, Science Fair and Junior Athletics Carnival just to name a few! We hope you all enjoyed the school holidays and that students are as ready and eager for Term 3 as we are.

Learning Goals

Literacy - Students will research an Australian animal of their choice and create an information report using their iPad. They must include the following sub headings: Classification, Appearance, Habitat, Diet and Conclusion. Students will present their information report orally to the class.

Numeracy - Students will use mathematical modelling to solve practical problems involving single-digit multiplication and division. They will recall multiplication facts for two, threes, fours, fives and tens, using a range of strategies. Students will use familiar metric units when estimating, comparing and measuring the attributes of objects mass and capacity. They will represent money values in different ways. Students will identify angles as measures of turn and compare them to right angles. They will interpret and create two-dimensional representations of familiar environments.

<u>Hass</u> - Students will explore the similarities and differences in places near and far. They will represent places on a map as well as represent, interpret and compare climate data between places. Students will then design a brochure for their chosen neighbouring country.

Art - Drama: Students will make and respond to drama by investigating ways that advertisers promote a product to the consumer. Students will create, perform and record an advertisement, promoting a breakfast cereal.

<u>Design Technology</u> - Students will explore food and fibre production, and will investigate sustainable practices. They will use this knowledge to design and build a greenhouse prototype using Strawbees.


